5 Key Things about For Children + Families

The new neighborhood at Centre Dandenong Road will reflect all that's great about Dingley Village. Feedback from locals over the past five years and the input of planning experts has been used to design an inclusive, attractive, high-quality residential development that will enhance the area for everyone who calls Dingley Village home.

The new neighbourhood will be a great place to grow up. Here are **5 key features in the new masterplan**.

1

The connection of the parks and green linear reserves will encourage **walking and cycling** throughout all of Dingley Village. Children will be able to cycle or walk to the parks or nearby schools and shops on dedicated paths. The design contributes to the "20-minute neighbourhood principle", where residents can meet most of their daily needs (eg, local public transport, local health facilities, schools, parks, shops and other local infrastructure) within a 20-minute return walk from home.

A Cultural Reserve on the site available to all will include interpretive installations designed to **acknowledge and share the cultural heritage** of the traditional owners of the land.

The concept plans for open space caters for all ages with **a range of facilities** including inclusive play and gathering spaces within the entry reserve, a fitness hub within the central reserve and dedicated spaces for junior play.

Viewing decks will be built beside the main wetlands at both the north and south of the site. Beside the biggest lake in the north-west corner, a picnic shelter, barbecue facilities, interpretive signage, and bike parking loops will be installed, making this a great spot to come together with friends and family.

The design includes the potential for the inclusion of a privately developed and run 120-place **child-care centre and kindergarten**. Community feedback and advice from Kingston Council shows that these services would be valued by the Dingley Village community.
